Tips on how to get the **best** out of your **Fashionshoot**

- Do your research – It is always a good idea to know what type of images you would like to go for before you come in. Flick through some fashion magazines, look at the posters in clothes shops you buy from, even note down some movies where you liked the way people were styled. All these ideas will be very useful during the session so make sure to bring in a few samples.
- Bring more than one outfit – To truly get a wide range of images it's best to bring a couple of different outfits. Make sure that they are all different from each other; there is not much point to bringing five t-shirts and a pair of jeans.

- Don't forget accessories – Many people always forget to bring in accessories, this is very important as these can add something extra to the image. Bring a selection of hats, scarves, jewellery and any other props you think may work.
- Make-up – This can sometimes be really difficult. We would suggest not putting on too much make-up and then bring along your make-up bag so you can apply some more as we go along.
- Have an open mind – Watch 'Britain's Next Top Model'. The photo shoots they have are often over the top and very dramatic. We may not be able to set up shots like those but it is always to good to watch how the models work and what is expected of them. The more you put in, the more you get out.
